Raymond Terrace CBD - High Pedestrian Activity Area

9 May 2023

We're upgrading sections of the road infrastructure within the Raymond Terrace CBD to improve safety by slowing vehicles down and improve pedestrian and vehicle interaction.

The works will include:

- Installing additional 40km High Pedestrian Activity Area (HPAA) Signage
- Changing a centre island to a pedestrian refuge along Glenelg Street near Port Stephens Street (in between the Terrace Centro shopping centre and the Service NSW building)
- Adjusting the King Street and William Street intersection to allow for additional parking and a safer crossing point for pedestrians across King Street
- Adjusting the centre raised median along Port Stephens Street adjacent to the Raymond Terrace marketplace complex, to slow vehicles down along this section of road
- Additional linemarking installed along Port Stephens Street, to assist with vehicle movement and interaction with cyclists and pedestrians

The reduced speed limit (from 50kmh) to 40kmh will make it safer for both drivers and pedestrians. These works have been endorsed and funded by the Federal Blackspot Program.

These works are scheduled to commence on 9 May 2023 (weather permitting). Traffic control will be in place during construction hours, please follow traffic control directions.
