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All Year 10 students are required to submit their final subject selections signed off by a parent/carer. This will be completed by filling out a form during the Decision Day zoom meeting on **Monday 17 August 2020**. If a parent/carer is unable to be present this form will need to be signed prior to the student's selections being finalized. Students will be provided with current subjects based on the timetable lines developed by the school.

Students are required to:

- 1) Check their selection from each line, and that their selection satisfies the rules for the HSC in terms of basic requirements and subject exclusions, as described in the Subject Information Package (available on the school's website). Some subjects that appear on these set of lines still may not be available in 2021.
- 2) If you wish to enrol in an externally delivered VET course you must make a separate application via our eVET co-ordinator Mr Lee (Career Advisor). He will discuss this with you during your meeting.
- 3) If you wish to participate in a traineeship or apprenticeship, if you have not already done so, please arrange to meet with Mr Lee.
- 4) Students need to only identify any changes they wish to discuss at the meeting.
- 5) Some classes are <u>over-subscribed</u> and students will receive advice to make changes to best suit their academic needs. Those students who submitted their online selections first will be given priority in these courses.

Courses that are currently over-subscribed include Community and Family Studies, Industrial Arts, and Visual Arts.

6) Students that have a blank subject in line 1-6 will need to discuss and select a subject in the missing line or elect an offline course in line 7. The blank subject may be because a subject selected online did not get the required number of students to be offered, or the reserve subjects could not be accommodated by the system

Year 11 & 12 PRIVILEGES & RESPONSIBILITIES

As senior students you are the leaders of our school. You are expected to use your time at school in a mature and productive way.

	Seniors are expected to attend roll call every day unless granted permission otherwise.
Students are not required to be at school if they have an early finish.	Once marked present at school, students have the responsibility to remain at school until their last timetabled class after which they can sign out into their parents/carers care through previously arranged leave. Seniors do not have permission to come and go from the school.
	Once signed out on study leave students are expected to have transport home. They should not be returning to school at the end of the day to catch the bus. If this is the case they should not be signing out.
	Students have a responsibility to be in the Senior Learning Area (SLA) during study lessons.
	This is the decision of the student, their parents or carers and the owners of the vehicle.
Seniors who have a license may drive to and from school	Students are advised to park in the visitor car park behind the hall. If you choose to park in the street ensure you are not parked across a driveway or in a No Parking or a No Stopping area.
	When arriving or departing school ensure you obey the road rules including the 40km/h school zone. Take particular care when entering or exiting the car park. Police and school based consequences may apply for unsafe behaviour.
Seniors have a flexible timetable.	Our broad curriculum allows for students to maintain many subjects opening choices and opportunities that many others around the State do not enjoy. Students are required to be in every timetabled lesson on time and with all necessary equipment.
Senior Students wear a different uniform.	You are the leaders of our school. Wear the uniform with pride, making the right choices each morning. You must wear black leather or suede leather shoes in order to comply with WH&S requirements. Uniform indicates to the school and the wider community that you are ready to work, proud of our school traditions and ready to become part of an adult community taking your responsibilities seriously. PE shirts are only worn during practical aspects of PDHPE courses.
Senior students have the right to study periods and must access the Senior Learning Area (SLA) during these periods.	Study quietly, respecting fellow students and our Senior Learning Area (SLA) staff.
