Each programme has an Academy room which is a safe, welcoming environment where positive relationships are forged. Our Academies provide an important school-engagement mechanism for many at-risk students who would otherwise not attend or have low school attendance. Full time, locally based Clontarf staff mentor and counsel students on a range of behavioural and lifestyle issues while the school caters for their educational needs. Using a comprehensive approach of supportive relationships, a welcoming environment, and a diverse range of activities, the participants develop improved self-esteem and confidence.
